



Visit South African National Parks

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South African National Parks: Addo Elephant, Agulhas, Augrabies, Bontebok, Camdeboo, Golden Gate Highlands, Kgalagadi Transfrontier, Garden Route (an amalgamation of Tsitsikamma, Knysna Lagoon and Indigenous Forests and the Wilderness Lake System), Karoo, Kruger, Mapungubwe, Marakele, Mokala, Mountain Zebra, Namaqua, Richtersveld, Table Mountain, Tankwa Karoo, West Coast.

This edition's featured park and camps are the south-eastern camps of Kruger National Park: Lower Sabie and Crocodile Bridge

- Both camps are best accessed through the Crocodile Bridge Entrance Gate
- Lower Sabie is on the south bank of the Sabie River, while Crocodile Bridge is on the north bank of the Crocodile River
- The south-eastern part of Kruger is arguably the best game viewing in the park and is especially good for zebra, wildebeest, giraffe, rhino, cheetah and lion.
- Lower Sabie has 9 accessible accommodation units (all but one have roll-in showers) out of 115 – two 3-bed riverside bungalows, one 2-bed riverside bungalow, one 3-bed bungalow (this unit has a bath), one 2-bed bungalow, one 6-bed guest-house and three 2-bed riverside safari tents
- Crocodile Bridge has 3 accessible accommodation units (with roll-in showers) out of 27 – two 3-bed bungalows and one 2-bed safari tent
- Both camps have accessible campsite ablutions (with roll-in showers)
- Accessible features in this area of the park include the Nthandanyathi Hide, Nkhuulu Picnic Site and the boardwalk at Lower Sabie leading from the restaurant deck.
