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South African National Parks: Addo Elephant, Agulhas, Augrabies, Bontebok, Camdeboo, Golden Gate Highlands, Kgalagadi Transfrontier, Garden Route (an amalgamation of Tsitsikamma, Knysna Lagoon and Indigenous Forests and the Wilderness Lake System), Karoo, Kruger, Mapungubwe, Marakele, Mokala, Mountain Zebra, Namaqua, Richtersveld, Table Mountain, Tankwa Karoo, West Coast.

This edition's featured park and camps are the south-western camps of Kruger National Park: Berg-en-Dal and Pretoriuskop Rest Camps

- Berg-en-Dal is best accessed through Malelane Gate; Pretoriuskop via Numbi or Phabeni Gates. There are accessible ablutions at Malelane and Phabeni.
- Berg-en-Dal is in the park's south western hills on the edge of Matjulu Dam; Pretoriuskop in the western part of the park's southern/Marula region.
- Both camps are renowned for rhino and wild dog, but have all the other major game, with Pretoriuskop being home to some of the park's rarer antelope species.
- Pretoriuskop is the park's oldest rest camp and Berg-en-Dal one of the newest. There are many historic sites in this region, including the Jock of the Bushveld Route.
- Each camp has 3 adapted accessible units. Berg-en-Dal has two 6-bed guest cottages (one with bath and grab rails, the other with roll-in shower) & a 3 bed bungalow (RI shower); Pretoriuskop has three 2-bed bungalows all with RI showers. There are accessible campsite ablutions in each camp.
- Both camps' central facilities are accessible (there is an alternative wheelchair entrance at P'kop's reception) and there are accessible toilets behind the B&D reception and in her conference facility, between the P'kop restaurant and shop and behind her reception.
- The Berg-en-Dal Conference and Wedding Venue is fully accessible to the mobility impaired.
- Both camps have in-camp trails that are partially accessible, while the Afsaal Picnic Site and Team Room (midway between the two camps) has accessible ablutions.
