Since its inception in the early 1970's, the Skukuza Indigenous Nursery has built up an impressive collection of trees, shrubs, and succulent that occurs within the Kruger National park and surrounds. The nursery only uses locally collected seeds and plant material for both nursery stock and research purposes. **Visitors are welcome to come and browse through the nursery and see the variety of indigenous plants available.**

- Quotes on large orders for landscaping/ new gardens



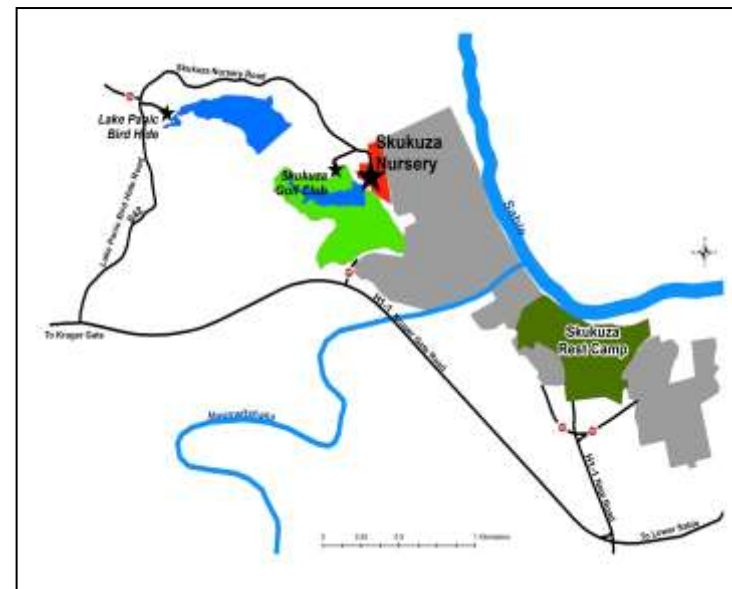
Opening hours
