TERMS OF REFERENCE – APPOINTMENT OF an ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS FOR MAINTENANCE, SERVICING AND REPAIRS OF ELECTRICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IN THE BONTEBOK NATIONAL PARK.

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this RFQ is to appoint an accredited electrical contractor for maintenance, service and repair on the Electrical Infrastructure Medium voltage 3k3 until 11kv in the Bontebok National Park for a period no more than three (3) years. The Service provider will enter in a Service Agreement with Sanparks for the period of Three (3) years.

2. BACKGROUND

South African National Parks (SANParks) is a public entity functioning under National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 (Act 57 of 2003); with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: public entities.

SANParks' operations are totally guided by its vision statement and mission statement. As a public entity, the organisation is committed to act in pursuance of transformation of South Africa's society in support of entrenching South Africa's democracy. In this regard, the organisation has adopted a transformation mission to guide its efforts accordingly.

LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- The bid is subject to the General Conditions of Contract issued per Treasury Regulation 16A published in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act 1 of 1999); Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000; and the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022.

- The Special Conditions of Contract are supplementary to that of the General Conditions of Contract. However, where the Special Conditions of Contract conflict with the General Conditions of Contract, the Special Conditions of Contract prevail.
- Bidders are required to be registered on the Central Supplier Database and the National Treasury shall verify the bidder's tax compliance status through the Central Supplier Database.
- Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the Central Supplier Database and their tax compliance status will be verified through the Central Supplier Database.

- The contract is for the appointment of an electrical contractors for maintenance, servicing and repair of MV electrical infrastructure as and when required in the Bontebok national park for the period of three (3) years. The installation of work should be in accordance with relevant SANS standards.
- Where the bid specifications make any reference to any particular trademark, name, patent, design, type, specific origin or producer, bidders must quote for product equivalent/similar to what is specified.

CONTRACT PERIOD

- The contract is for a period of three (3) years on an as and when required basis.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work involves the appointment of an electrical contractors for maintenance, servicing and repair of MV electrical infrastructure as and when required in the Bontebok national park for the period of Three (3) years.

The installation of work should be in accordance with relevant SANS standards.

3.1.1 Management, staff, contractors, and representatives

The Service Provider shall use certified, trained, skilled staff or contractors while performing the service levels defined in the below. The service Provider will ensure that the management, staff or contractor employed to perform the agreed services are available and competent to perform such service at the required service levels.

Credentials requirement essential and registration documentation to be provided with Team organigram structure for services.

DETAILED PRICING – SBD 3.1 (FIRM UNIT PRICES)

- Price quoted **must be fully inclusive of all costs** including disbursements and other overheads, delivery to the specified SANParks Business Unit geographical address and includes value- added tax, including customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or other applicable tax.
- Price changes whether as a result of CPI, PPI, extensions or expansions will be allowed in terms of the signed contract by both parties.
- Bidders must quote for **all** requirements listed on the price schedules. Bidders who does not quote for all listed items will not be considered for further evaluations.
- Where the bid specifications make any reference to any particular trademark, name, patent, design, type, specific origin or producer, bidders must quote for product equivalent/similar to what is specified.

This BOQ does not have total quantities, only unit rates are required to be used for price evaluation purposes. For items that are not listed on the BOQ a 15% mark-up/handling fee will be allowed, of which an original quotation from the original equipment manufacturer or distributor or supplier will be required to ascertain that the mark-up/handling fee is not more than 15%.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa, words in the masculine mean in the feminine and neuter, words “department” means organs of state inclusive of public entities and vice versa, and the words “will/should” mean “must”. **South African National Parks (SANParks) cannot amend the National Treasury’s General Conditions of Contract (GCC). SANParks appends Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) providing specific information relevant to a GCC clause that requires the addition of Special Conditions and Special Conditions specific to this bid contract is not part of the General Conditions of Contract. No clause in this document shall be in conflict with another clause. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions of the Special Conditions of Contract shall prevail.**
