1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this request is to appoint a service provider for the repairs, maintenance, supply and installation of weather stations and water level equipment to the Wilderness section of the Garden Route National Park for a period of five (5) years

2. BACKGROUND

South African National Parks (SANParks) is a public entity functioning under National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 (Act 57 of 2003); with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: public entity.

The primary mandate of SANParks is to expand, protect, conserve, and control the system of national parks, terrestrial and marine, that it is assigned to manage. SANParks currently manages over 4 million hectares of terrestrial and 369 657 ha marine protected biodiversity through a system of 21 National Parks and 10 Marine Protected Areas: (MPAs), representing approximately 67% of state owned terrestrial protected areas and 22% of State Managed MPAs. This places SANParks in an ideal position to not only meaningfully contribute to the protection and sustainable use of the megadiverse biodiversity of South Africa, but also to be a key player in building climate resilience through ecosystem-based mitigation and adaptation.

3. TERMS OF REFERENCE

SANParks currently have 8 internet-based weather stations that provide live weather data with online log in functionality. It is likely that the number of weather stations will increase as additional funding is made available. The weather stations are part of the Park Management Risk Management system which informs decision making around flood and fire risk. Timeous repairs and services are vital to minimise the loss of data and availability of data and quick turnaround on repairs are critical. Service provider is required to ensure that the annual subscription fees are paid and to supply parts and repair services to ensure optimal operational functioning. Service provider is required to install new weather stations where required upon approval. SANParks will conduct repairs and routine maintenance infield. Infield services are not required.

The successful service provider will supply, deliver, install, and commission ruggedised data loggers and smart water meters to remotely monitor water infrastructure. Primary sites in the Garden Route National Park and phased approach of installation of devices. Once all areas have been supplied with products, all new hardware supplied under this contract in the 5-year period must integrate seamlessly into a Zednet Web-Based Platform using the ZED_6000_2 (5-Year Site Subscription) software protocol.

This contract will include:

- Annual airtime subscription of weather stations
- Repairs
 - Parts – annual % increase on parts for 5 years
 - Proof of cost for parts must be supplied when repairs and parts are requested
 - Labour rates for repairs at service provider's workshop
 - Telephonically available to assist with infield problem solving
- Provision of automated weather stations as required with the following specifications and functionality
- VIF Weather station, Wind, temperature, rainfall, pressure solar powered modem & battery included
- Subscription vital weather
- Mounting tripod
- Solar radiation sensor VP
- Mounting (Brackets Solar RAD/ UV)

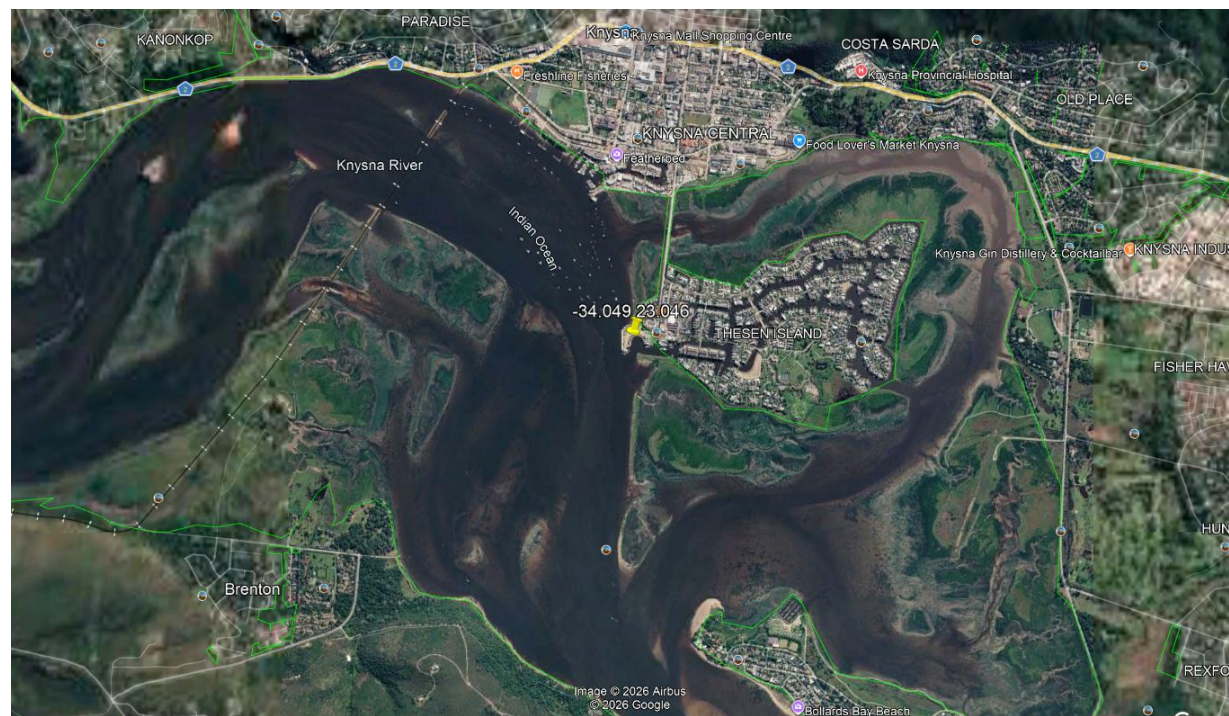
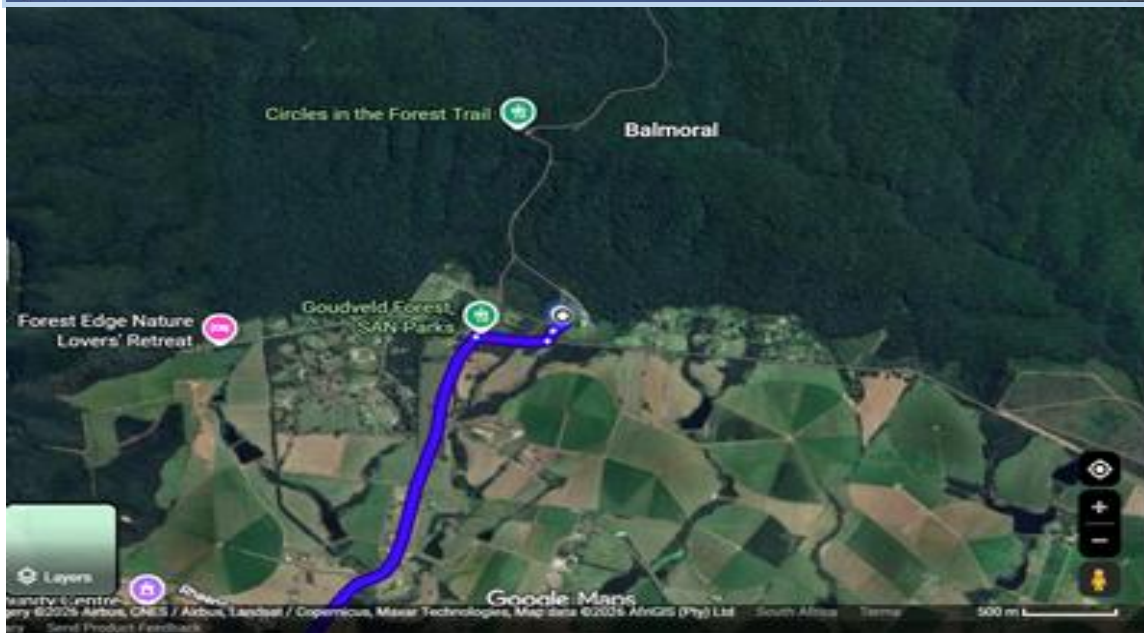
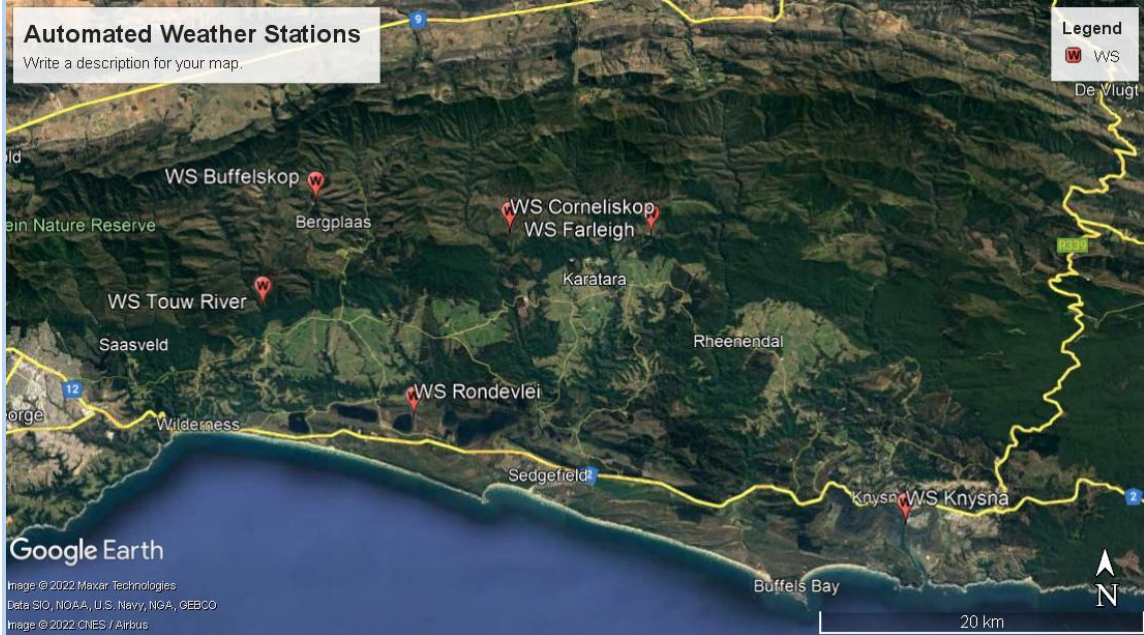
Technical Specifications for Water Telemetry Hardware & System Integration

- **General System Architecture Data Flow:** Hardware must capture volumetric flow and system pressure, log the values locally, and transmit data via a secure cellular link to the centralized Zednet server environment.
- **Telemetry Data Logger Specifications Channels/Inputs:**
Minimum of 2x Digital Pulse Inputs supporting bi-directional tracking (forward and reverse flow accumulation) from passive reed switches or active solid-state pulse modules. Minimum of 1x Analogue Input (4-20mA or 0-10V) for pressure transducer loop connection. Internal Memory: Non-volatile internal flash memory storing a minimum of 50,000 logging records to protect historical data in the event of local cellular carrier network outages.
- **Logging Intervals:** Programmable logging configuration down to 15-minute intervals, adjustable over-the-air (OTA) via the software interface. Local Diagnostics: Protected optical port or encrypted Bluetooth connection allowing safe on-site programming and manual log harvesting without breaking the enclosure seals.
- **Smart Metering & Physical Sensor Specifications Volumetric Meters:**
Woltman-type mechanical, electromagnetic, or ultrasonic bulk meters fitted with compatible, high-resolution pulse output heads. Pressure Transducers: Piezoresistive or ceramic strain-gauge pressure sensors featuring a monitoring scale of 0 to 16 Bar (or 0-25 Bar as defined by site zone profiles), wired into the logger loop via a protected, waterproof cable.

Water Meter Standards: Fully compliant with SANS 1529-1 or SANS 10378 standards and holding active type-approval certificates from the National Regulator for Compulsory Specifications (NRCS).

1 GENERAL CONDITIONS
