1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this request is to appoint/invite suitable service providers to quote for the supply and delivery of a Service Provider for services of a facilitation team for programme tutoring sessions at a primary school in an Addo, Gqeberha location community, for a 12-month period between the years 2026 to 2028. The project provides additional assistance to scholars to ensure they meet their basic grade-level expectations. The computer system the programme utilises is the school-In-A-Box Programme that uses academic material for the CAPS curriculum. The hardware is uploaded with academic content, lessons, and tests in various subjects for all grades.

To date the programme is oversubscribed with over 245 learners enrolled on the after-school programme, which is indication of the project demand in a single school. Bidders must present a programme plan to ensure that the tutoring programme are delivered timeously to the scholars at the school.

BACKGROUND

South African National Parks (SANParks) is a public entity functioning under National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003 (Act 57 of 2003); with the mandate to conserve; protect; control; and manage national parks and other defined protected areas and their biological diversity (Biodiversity). As a public entity, SANParks is also governed by the Public Finance Management Act, Act 1 of 1999 (as amended by Act 29 of 1999), and it is listed as Schedule 3 Part A: public entity.

The primary mandate of SANParks is to expand, protect, conserve, and control the system of national parks, terrestrial and marine, that it is assigned to manage. SANParks currently manages over 4 million hectares of terrestrial and 369 657 ha marine protected biodiversity through a system of 21 National Parks and 10 Marine Protected Areas: (MPAs), representing approximately 67% of state owned terrestrial protected areas and 22% of State Managed MPAs. This places SANParks in an ideal position to not only meaningfully contribute to the protection and sustainable use of the megadiverse biodiversity of South Africa, but also to be a key player in building climate resilience through ecosystem-based mitigation and adaptation.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work is to invite a credible service provider to provide a quote for the supply of Service Provider for services of a facilitation team for the programme tutoring sessions at a primary school in an Addo, Gqeberha location community, for a 12-month period between the years 2026 to 2028.

The project team must provide additional assistance to scholars to ensure they meet their basic grade-level expectations, at the school after normal class sessions as an afterschool programme. Such that the bidder must contract with the school for bimonthly programme implementation evaluation reports for the programme improvements.

The project team must display the facilitation of the programme lessons, utilizing the hardware and software that uses academic material for the CAPS curriculum, as a virtual bidders shortlisted interview presentation. The presentation must display the academic content, lessons, and tests in various subjects for all grades. Including presenting how the programme can support the oversubscribed list of over 200 learners enrolled on the programme. Bidders must present a programme plan to ensure that the tutoring programme are delivered timeously to the scholars at the school.

The bidder must present programme facilitation plans to Addo Elephant National Park with:

- Related curriculum vitae (maximum three/3 pages) and, South African Police Services (SAPS) clearance report not older than three/3 months from the project manager, lead tutor and assistant tutor. Any personnel changes must be approved by the school and SANParks program team.
- Related programme team contracts for a 12-month period between the years 2026 to 2028.
- Maximum one page motivation for working in Addo, Gqeberha location school and community.
- Documented evidence (maximum 15 pages) of similar programme implementation with scholars.
- Present a simple documented (maximum three/3 pages) programme lessons plan to support 200 learners enrolled in this programme.
- Be available to present virtually or in person (at own cost at the Addo school) a lesson facilitation for different subjects and grades as they best can. The SANParks programme team and Addo school representatives will be the interviewer to engage the bidder.
- During the programme the successful bidder will invoice SANPark for bimonthly payment for their services as per programme contract signed with the school.
